Elevators are located by the north and south entrances.

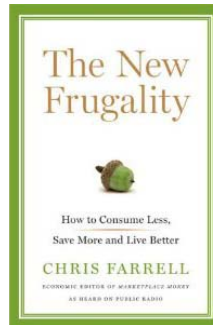
Large Print Bulletins and **Hearing Enhancement Units** for use during worship are available from the ushers.
